The book helps students understand how social workers use their professional expertise to assist people in solving a wide variety of problems to improve their lives. There are three major parts:

The first part, **Social Work and its Context**, comprises four chapters which introduce the profession of social work, provide theoretical perspectives underlying generalist practice, investigate the concept of social justice, and explore social welfare policy and its history.

The second part, **Professional Practice Settings**, offers an in-depth discussion of eight fields of practice: family and children's services, mental health, health care, schools, older adult services, criminal justice, and developmental disabilities.

The third and final part, **A Look to the Future**, views the profession through the eyes of futurists and explores the challenges and opportunities that await new social workers.

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- *Improve Critical Thinking* — Discussions on values, ethics, human diversity,

and generalist social work practice throughout stimulate students to think critically about varying issues.

- *Engage Students* — Case studies introduce each chapter and are carefully developed to illustrate the myriad of problems that social workers deal with in daily practice.
- *Explore Current Issues* — Includes new content on a variety of issues, including policy diversity, the environment, and much more.
- *Apply CSWE Core Competencies* — The text integrates the 2008 CSWE EPAS, with critical thinking questions and practice tests to assess student understanding and development of competency.
